COMMENTARY

Week 28

And so, after 19 matches stretching back to the end of September 2016, the title race came down to the final match of the final week of the season - Credex versus Castaways. The drama began even before the first ball was served, as it emerged that the injury Andy Nash sustained in the previous week meant he couldn't be risked for this match. A hammer blow for Castaways as Andy would have been an automatic selection. The first set of the night involved the top two players in the averages: Adewale versus Harris. The set scores were close but Harris could never get his nose in front and went down three straight. That triggered a run of four straight losses for Castaways and the writing was on the wall as they only managed to win one end in those four singles. Then followed the best set of the night as Harris faced Persaud. Pete was looking good having taken the first two ends but Laikram fought back to win the third and fourth ends. A real nail biter in the fifth as the players swapped points as the score moved towards the apparently inevitable deuce-in-the-fifth scenario. As the points played out it didn't quite get that far with Harris squeezing home by 11-9. A very close set! Next set was another victory for Credex as Perry Fung beat Neil LeMilliere by a surprisingly comfortable three straight. Next came the longest set of the night as Keld Jaksland fought really hard against Persaud but lost 11-5 in the fifth. Pete Harris scored a consolation win over but Perry Fung but the title race was over with Credex running out the winner by 8-2. Heartbreak for Castaways, for the second successive year being top at halfway but being overhauled by Credex in the second half. To put Credex's comeback in perspective, since Christmas they contested 100 sets and won 94 of them! Treasury A finish third, their final match being a whitewash of BTB. Eight sets finished three straight with Jeremy Jones dropping an end to both Xavier and Roberts. Nat West finish fourth, a very creditable performance given their team selection problems this season. They took on Employment and won 7-3. This was a good match. Chis Herbert beat Paul Baylis in four very close ends. Anita Jermyn put up a good fight against Tony Catt, losing 14-12 in the fourth. And, closest of all, Richard Mak going down 11-5 in the fifth against Herbert. Morpeth come next in the table, finishing with a 10-0 defeat of BTB. This wasn't plain sailing for Morpeth and oddly it was their best player Sammy Bekele who struggled. Doug Lavis matched him all the way over four ends but came apart in the fifth, losing 11-4. Alec Fenn was two ends to one up against Bekele and came within two points of winning the set only to be edged out 11-6 in in the fifth. Treasury B completed a disappointing season

with a 7-3 loss to a two-man Comets team. For Comets, Steve Fagan won all his sets three straight. Steve Codrington did the same but dropped an end to both Okai and Colgan and really rode his luck against David Shore, wining a long set 11-9 in the fifth. Best set of the night was a very even doubles which Treasury lost 11-9 in the fifth, having won the first two ends!

The closest finish ever to a season in Division One. The best team won but Castaways put up an impressive fight. With Adewale in the team, Credex usually started 4-0 up against everyone. Third to fifth positions were very close with just six points separating them. Credit to Treasury A for finishing top of the bunch and up from fifth place last season. In Chris Penrose, Nat West have the second strongest player in the Division and they had to use him more than usual this season with Samuels and Herbert out of action for much of the time. Not the easiest of seasons for Nat West but well done in fulfilling all their fixtures. In fifth spot, we find Morpeth who were involved in some of the most entertaining matches of the season. They have a strong squad but I think this strange phenomenon – intended or otherwise - of rarely fielding the same three players in two successive matches probably works against them finishing higher. Employment and Comets have been neck and neck all season but Employment just come home in front. Baylis and McKee are capable of winning one or two sets most weeks and combined with the ever-present Richard Mak and an improved contribution from Anita Jermyn made for a very satisfactory season with a noticeably better second half than first half. Comets, on the other hand, are all about the two Steves. Steve Fagan was the highest player in the averages other than players from Credex and Castaways. Steve Codrington is a solid number two but they need a regular number three to go any further. PRO started well but then fell away a bit after Christmas. They won six matches – all against the teams finishing beneath them – and that kept them well away from the relegation zone. A bit like PRO, Treasury B won four matches, all against teams beneath them. The margins of those wins provide ample evidence that they were better than the teams in the relegation positions. I have a lot of respect for Old Seds and BTB. They battled on throughout despite being on the wrong end of most matches. BTB have a settled squad and field Roberts, Xavier and Waterhouse almost every week. It is to their credit that in only one match did they fail to field three players. Seds have a bigger squad which, despite finishing well adrift, was more capable of surprise wins and near misses than BTB. Only in the last two matches of the season did they fail to field a full team. All in all, a very interesting season!

Fewest points in a five-ender: 77 points when Treasury A played the doubles against Comets

Great escapes: George Buck beating Rod Fitzgerald from 10—4 down in the fifth. Perry Fung saving a hatful of match points against Paul Baylis.

Upset of the season?: George Buck beating Adam Johnson three straight!!

Memorable team performances: PRO drawing with Nat West. Nat West beating both Castaways and Credex. Morpeth getting so close to NatWest. Morpeth beating Treasury A despite an injured Sammy Bekele. Treasury A beating Nat West 6-4. And Castaways 7-3 win over Credex in the first half.
