Now he wants to play abroad in a para TT championship and growing numbers of people are contributing funds to help him. Simon says:

I have thrown myself into TT again at the age of 64 and am playing more than I ever did. Got picked by GB Para to play in the Costa Rica Para Open in December and am going to play in the IWAS World Games in Thailand from 2nd to 9th April. (International Wheelchair Amputee Sports Federation) as GB's only representative across 12 sports and over 500 athletes. I will be travelling on my own with just my wheelchair and bat.

DIVISION ONE





Berkshire Inter-Town Report

The annual Berkshire 'Inter Town' tournament took place on 19 January at Cippenham, with the four representative leagues - Reading, Newbury, Bracknell and Maidenhead - vying for the Barbara Peisley trophy. As holders, Reading started as favourites but faced some strong opposition, particularly from the Newbury league which has strengthened considerably over the past couple of seasons.

The tournament is played across six mini-leagues with points awarded according to where teams are placed after matches against their three opponents. In both the Senior and Veteran categories there are three Divisions and each team consists of three players each playing two singles matches against their opponents.

Due to County commitments, Reading were missing some of its premier players this year, including Martin Adams and Hari Gehlot. In addition, injury and absence accounted for Mark Banks and Andy Wang meaning that the four biggest 'stars' from the 2019 campaign all needed to be replaced.

For the Senior Division 1 team, the talented Dmitry Khakhamov stepped up as player A, with in-form Graham Mendick and Ben Law supporting him. A fast start saw Reading defeat two-man Bracknell 6 - 0 in its opening match, although Ben Law needed a fifth game 13-11 decider to squeeze out a brave Phil Mead effort. The same result followed against Maidenhead with Graham Mendick showing signs of his recent league form in defeating both his opponents in straight sets.

The third and final encounter against Newbury proved to be a much tighter contest. The brilliant Romanian, Mizcea Neago, defeated both Dmitry and Graham in straight sets. However, Graham defeated Jamie Cole and Ben proved too good for Antony Baker leaving the contest down to the final two singles' matches. Newbury's Baker upped his game against Dmitry and had chances to go 2 - 1 up but Dmitry stormed back to win the third and fourth legs and take Reading to 3 - 2. In another close contest Ben came back from a first game deficit to defeat Jamie 3 - 1 and take the match 4 - 2.

In the Division 1 veterans mini-league, Duncan Groves was promoted following Mark Banks' withdrawal and joined Neil Hurford and Tony Stead in matches against Newbury and Bracknell (Maidenhead did not field a side). In his opening match against the excellent Paul Rattue, Neil showed great form and consistency in winning in four sets. Duncan chipped in with an important defeat of Nick Langley and Tony disposed of Phil Davenport with relative ease. Neil also saw off Nick Langley in a comfortable three sets. With the match at 4 - 0 and won, Newbury showed what could have been by coming back to win the last two singles.

Neil kept up his terrific form in the second and final match against Bracknell, defeating both Ian Cole and Ivor Hardman. The Hurford v Cole match was one of the day's highlights with some thrilling rallies from these contrasting style players ending with a 14-12 fourth deciding set Reading win after Ian had several chances to scrape back to 2 - 2. The match was eventually won 6 - 0 with a notable win for Tony Stead over Ian Cole and solid wins for Duncan over Ivor and Tim Challender.

The Reading Senior Division 2 side looked extremely strong on paper with Julian Telford and Joe Barraclough supporting Dan Wills. So it turned out in 6 - 0 drubbings

of both Bracknell and Maidenhead with only three sets dropped across all 12 matches. As expected, the Newbury encounter would prove decisive. The match started with the narrowest of victories by Dan over Fallon Thompson and this was followed by comfortable wins from Joe, over Bill Stamatiou, and Julian, over Tom Lewis. Another classic five-game set saw Newbury back in the

match as Fallon defeated Joe 14-12 in the deciding game. No such problems, however, for Dan or Julian in their final matches and Reading took another minileague maximum with a 5 - 1 defeat of Newbury.

The most comfortable mini-league for Reading players turned out to be Veteran Division 2. Alan Cummings, returning from injury, was partnered by league team

mates Paul Savage and Nick Sears. All three showed excellent form and were largely untroubled as they earned 6 - 0 victories in all three encounters. Highlights were a five game win by Alan over Mark Wheeler from Newbury and Nick's hard fought victory over Elroy Hull from Maidenhead. Meanwhile Paul swept aside all comers with six straight game wins.

The only Reading side to miss out on topping their mini-league was the Senior Division 3 side. Due to a last minute absence from the third player in the team, Matt Stone and Jingshun (Jordan) Huang had to start each match with a 2 - 0 deficit. Despite this, they managed to win 4 - 2 against both Maidenhead and Bracknell teams. Special mention for the 'never say die' Matt Stone who came back from 2 - 1 down in sets versus Allan Yeung to secure the Bracknell win. The Reading v Newbury match ended with a 4 - 2 defeat after Andy Jeffery pipped Matt in five sets and Jordan lost out in a close match against Simon Craig. Both players should, however, feel proud of their second place in the mini-league, given the circumstances.

The tightest mini-league of the day involved Division 3 veterans. Reading's team consisted of Pete Bradley, Barry Carter and Roger Pritchard. Despite strong competition from both Bracknell and Maidenhead teams, Reading went into the final match against Newbury with two 6 - 0 victories under its belt. The decisive match saw some thrilling action and the only tied result across the day's matches. It started with Denise Weller coming from 2 - 1 down to record a 3 - 2 sets win over Pete. Barry then defeated Ian Wu and Roger edged out Sue Purton. Playing impressively, Denise earned her brace with a victory over Barry. Pete looked out of sorts in a straight set loss to Sue setting up a final singles encounter of the day between Roger and Ian. A five game win for Reading would have given the organiser a 'count back' headache but Roger kept a cool head to win 11-9, 11-6, 11-4. As a result, Reading took first

> place in the mini-league, despite the 3 - 3 finish, based on a 12-10 games count across the six matches.

With a grand total of 23 Peisley points, Reading comfortably retained the trophy from nearest rivals, Newbury. Well done to all Reading players who represented the League magnificently, both in terms of performance and behaviour.

Thanks must go to Mick Mitcham who did a fantastic job as tournament organiser and to the venue at Cippenham for hosting this event. We look forward to defending our trophy here next year.

he promotion fight has become even more interthird. 
Prediction –3rd



Alan Mollett and Jon Abbott are both still playing well and have averages of over 70%. It is also good to see Mark Jones back playing regularly and he has started to pick up some useful wins.

All of their defeats during the season have come against the top three and they look very likely to finish in a welldeserved fourth place. If we were using the old points system they would still have an outside chance of promotion.

Best Recent Performance – Alan Mollett with a very good three straight victory over the hard to beat Darek Kaminski

OLOP 'B' are comfortably lying in fifth place and they still have an outside chance of pipping SC&P 'D' for fourth. They have won four and lost two since Christmas and this included a great 6 – 4 victory over the leaders Tilehurst Meths 'A'. Tom Lewis is still their star player on 83% but the rest of the team all have healthy averages. They hardly ever have anyone who does not win at least once a match and most of their players results have improved as the season has gone on. So like SC&P 'D' they win most weeks although their results are often quite close.

Best Recent Performance – Pat Daniels with an excellent three straight win over Sanket Dave Prediction – 5th

Kingfisher 'D' have a had a mixed bag of recent results with three wins and three losses; three very close matches and three very clear-cut results. Their best performance was when their two-man team of Clive Gold and Luca Bianchi only just lost 6 - 4 to second placed OLOP 'A' and they were very close to getting a draw. Clive and Luca have the highest averages with both in the mid 60's with David Wells



Milestone 'A' have put their uncertain early season form well behind them and have won five of their last six matches with their only recent defeat coming against Sonning Sports 'A'. Their improved form has seen them move into a comfortable mid-table position. Both Sanket Dave and Zoltan Kelemen have been in very good form and they have been getting good back up from their other players. With two of the top three still to play they may have an effect on the promotion situation as they are a

With an equally creditable performance, **Brett Hastings** was also unbeaten on the night with two from two. Despite the comfortable looking scoreline, given a couple of nets or






edges the other way and it could possibly have been a different outcome.

his is possibly one of the most closely contested title fights for many a year and, with most teams only having five matches left to play, I still can't say for certain who will be top of the Division and who will be bottom. However, in order to get everyone "involved", my latest prognostications that Sonning Common are Peppard 'G' will win the Division and that Tidmarsh 'E' will take the wooden spoon, with Reading FC 'B' taking the runners-up spot. The fact that this season we are allocating a point per set may be to the detriment of SC&P 'G' and is the reason behind my decision in the case of Tidmarsh 'E'. The 'G' team may yet rue turning up to play their 'F' team without a third player, but the fact that Reading FC 'B' and Sonning Common & Peppard 'E', both title contenders, have to play each other twice is a significant factor, since a big win, by either team, may allow them to claim the Title.


Simon Berry (Sonning Common & Peppard 'G') tops the Individual Averages, having only dropped one set all season and Azaan Ali (Kingfisher 'H') is second, having also dropped only one set. These two teams have a match scheduled so it will be interesting if they are both selected to play. Third in the Individual Averages is Ian Davenport (Sonning Common & Peppard 'E'), who has only dropped two sets, followed by Melvyn Lovegrove (Sonning Common & Peppard 'G') in fourth and Joe Bull (Reading FC 'B') in fifth. On the flip side, there are just two regulars still looking for their first competitive win - Steve Knott (Sonning Common & Peppard 'F') and Emily Goodall (Springfield 'D'). Hopefully you are both still enjoying playing table tennis and please remember that the breakthrough moment can come at any time. It should be noted that both these players have recently garnered crucial points for their teams, when their opponents could only field two players.

In the Doubles Averages, Melvyn Lovegrove & Simon Berry (Sonning Common & Peppard 'G') are streets ahead of everyone else, having played together 15 times, never having lost. Other undefeated pairs are Freedom Agindotan & Joe Bull (Reading FC 'B'), who have played together 6 times, and Anthony Reeve & Ian Davenport (Sonning Common & Peppard 'E'), who have played together four times.

As expected, Simon Berry tops the Player of the Match table, with 12 awards, Azaan Ali is second with 9 awards, followed by Anthony Reeve (7) in third place, Freedom Agindotan (6) in fourth place, with Derek Wavell (5) and Qing Wu (5) in joint fifth.

Since the last Newsletter, **Kennet Valley Free Church 'B'**, like most teams, have played a further six matches, winning three and losing three. They started with a 7 - 3 defeat, away to Our Lady of Peace 'F', with Lewis Oke and Roshan Patel winning one set each and also being victorious in the Doubles, for the first time, on their third attempt. Russell Moores made up the team but had no luck, losing all three singles in what has been his last outing to date. Two weeks later, another 7 - 3 defeat, this time at the hands of visitors Kingfisher 'H', Roshan going one better than last time by

winning two singles but with Toby Barter having no joy and Jamie Li-Telford winning just one, that was as good as it got. However, the fact that 40 games were played in this match highlights that the contest



was closer than the score line might indicate.

Steve Christelow returned from his second injury to lead the team to an 8 - 2 victory, away at Springfield 'D', with Steve and Lewis both recording maximums, as well as recording a further Doubles win together, while Toby chipped in with one win. A team effort proved to be sufficient for a 6 - 4 win, at home to Reading FC 'B', with Steve and Lewis each winning two, as did returnee Roshan. But, on another day, it could have been even sweeter, since Derek Anderson only just beat Lewis 12-10 11-9 12-10 and Roshan only lost to Derek 11-5 5-11 11-9 9-11 7-11.



Their next match, away at Sonning Common & Peppard 'G', resulted in a 6 - 4 defeat, with Toby (one win), Steve (two wins) and Jamie (one win) winning the same number of sets as in their previous matches. A new Doubles pairing of Steve & Toby was tried but they lost 1 - 3. The final match ended in an emphatic 9 - 1 win over Tidmarsh 'E', their best result in 2020, Toby and Lewis both recording their second trebles of the Season, with Roshan being denied his maximum when he lost his second set to Steve Andrews. On the Doubles front, a different pairing was tried in each match, with three pairs winning and three losing. The good news is that Lewis Oke & Steve Christelow are now officially their best Doubles pair, with two wins from two outings.

Kingfisher 'H' have only lost three times this Season, winning their other twelve matches. However, their winning margins have not been as good as the competition, which is why they currently find themselves in fourth place, equal on points with Reading FC 'B' who have a better set average,

Azaan recorded another straight games treble, Roger could only manage a double after losing his final set to Julian James while Gill snatched a win, in her final set, beating Alistair Scott 3-11 11-9 12-10 13-11, which all added up to a 7 - 3 victory. The following week, Kingfisher travelled to Milestone, but were only able to field two players. Luckily, Roger was on form and recorded a maximum, while Ania recorded two wins, Carl Edlind coming out on top in their 4th set battle, winning 12-10 11-13 14-12 10-12 11-7, to

despite winning fewer matches. They have matches against each team in the top three, so the opportunity to change their fortunes is in their own hands, although my current prediction is that they will finish the Season in 4th place.

deny Ania her h a t - t r i c k . However, the 4 - 6 match win was secured thanks to Ania & Roger's 9-11 9-11 11-5 11-8 11-9 Doubles win, over Carl Edlind & John Evans.

The final match of this Quarter was at home to Our Lady of Peace 'F' and

for the second week running, Kingfisher could only field two players, Azaan and Gill. Azaan needed 5 games to best Qing Wu but triumphed to record yet another treble, however Gill could only record the one win, an 8-11 11-9 11-9 11-6 defeat of Rudresh Desai. This loss is probably sufficient to dent Kingfisher's title aspirations, although their final position will depend upon the results against their three nearest rivals for promotion. On the Doubles front, Kingfisher 'H' won four of the six doubles matches played, with two new pairings being tried, Ania & Roger being successful while Azaan & Gill lost. With a second win, Azaan & Roger are now the team's most successful pair, although there are three other pairs on 100%.

Milestone 'C' are one of the teams that are in the fight to avoid last place but, when they started their last match before Christmas, they were currently the incumbents. Carl Edlind, Colin Phillips and John Evans were selected to play Sonning Common & Peppard 'F', who had fielded both Derek Wavell and



Julian James, their two strongest players. Derek and Julian were undefeated on the night, at least in the singles, Carl & John being victorious when they played them in the Doubles. Along with the Doubles, Carl, Colin and John all beat Alistair Scott, the Commoners third player, and thus the match ended in a 4 - 6 defeat.

Due to other results, these four points were not enough to climb up the table and therefore Milestone remained in 11th place going into the New Year. Their first opponents of 2020 were not an easy touch, since this was a battle of top versus bottom, with Milestone travelling to Sonning Common & Peppard to play the 'E' team. For this away trip, Colin had dropped out and Tony Hayden had stepped into the fray but he had no joy, his best opportunity for a win being his contest with David Pearson, which Tony lost 6-11 11-9 11-7 11-13 11-8. Carl and John fared slightly better, both defeating David to gain their team's only points. However, Carl had two knife-edge games with Anthony Reeve, losing 15-17 3-11 10-12 and John had a similarly close tussle with Jim Warren, losing 9-11 2-11 9-11.

Again, these two points were insufficient to catch Springfield 'D', in 10th, Springfield also having played one fewer match. And it got no better the following week, when the in-form Our Lady of Peace 'F' were the visitors. For their visit, Carl took a break

Colin returned but opponents Jan Polnik, Qing Wu and Alona Slobodskoy were almost unstoppable, John providing the only breakthrough in the match, when he beat Alona over 4 games, the match thus ending 1 - 9, although Colin surely worried Qing before losing 12-14 6-11 10-12. Milestone didn't have a match the following week, so they were still in 11th place, two weeks later, when Kingfisher 'H', another team vying for promotion, were the visitors. For this visit, it was Tony's turn to drop, with Carl stepping back into the team. Buoyed by the fact that there were only two opponents, there were a number of cracking 4 and 5 game sets. Carl did eventually get the better of Ania Pytka, winning 12-10 11-13 14-12 10-12 11-7, in one of the tightest sets of the season, but although John came close to defeating Roger Prew, losing two of the four games 10-12 and 11-13, the final match score ended 4 - 6.

For their first match in February, Milestone travelled to Springfield 'D' for a crucial bottom of the table clash. Possibly not realising how crucial, they left someone behind and only Tony and John made the journey ! John reprised his success from the reverse fixture and won all his singles, but Tony improved, this time winning twice by defeating Emily Goodall and Colin Jones, Chris Taylor proving to be too tough, which meant that the match was drawn 5 - 5. Although still bottom, these points meant that **10th** place was again within striking distance. Their final match of this Quarter was another contest against a promotion candidate, this time Reading FC 'B', and Carl, Colin and John were selected to play. Carl lost his first set, to Freedom Agindotan, but recovered to beat Derek Anderson 11-8 8-11 11-6 6-11 11-7 and Harry Edwards. Both Colin & John also beat Harry and with Carl & John winning what proved to be a crucial doubles, the points were shared 5 - 5.

This win means that they have moved off the bottom of the table, ceding that position to Tidmarsh 'E', who have played one more match. On the Doubles front, no new partnerships have been tried, and Milestone has stuck with the same three combos. There have been two wins, from six outings, both courtesy of Carl & John, who also lost one, which makes this duo Milestone's best with 50%.

Our Lady of Peace 'F' was in 6th place, one point behind Kennet Valley Free Church 'B', having won 5 and drawn 1 of the 9 matches they had played. Their last match before Christmas was at home to the aforementioned Kennet Valley and the subsequent 7 - 3 win meant that they not only swapped places with Kennet Valley, but also temporarily climbed above Reading FC 'B', whose match was postponed. Although Jan Polnik beat Russell Moores to record one win, the victory was secured by maximums from both Qing Wu and Alona Slobodskoy, Alona having to work hard to narrowly defeat Roshan Patel 7-11 8-11 11-7 12-10 11-9.

In their first match of the New Year, OLOP selected the same team to face visitors Sonning Common & Peppard 'F' and won 10 - 0 to record their best result of the season. Jan recorded his first maximum of the season and Jan & Alona got back to winning ways in the Doubles. Although this looked like an easy victory, with only 33 games played, 14 of these games were won by the minimum two points, 13 by OLOP and 1 by SC&P (Alistair Scott). Curiously none of the first three sets had a game score of 11-9 or more. This win consolidated 4th place and the following week the same players travelled to Milestone 'C' where an early defeat for Alona, at the hands of John



Evans, meant that they had to settle for a 9 - 1 victory. There were only 8 games that went to 11-9 or more, however the ratio was 7 to 1 in OLOP's favour and there were five 4-game sets. Jan recorded only his second treble and also his first PoM, while Qing racked up his seventh treble.

Table toppers Sonning Common & Peppard 'E' were the next visitors and Rudresh Desai was drafted in to replace Alona. This was a more competitive match than the 2 - 8 scoreline would indicate, with 41 games being played, 13 going to 11-9 or more, the balance being much more even. However, the stats will show that Rudresh lost all three, as did Jan, although his 8-11 12-10 7-11 11-5 9-11 loss to Anthony Reeve could so easily have been a win, Qing losing his final set to lan Davenport 11-9 14-12 8-11 5-11 4-11, which determined who went home undefeated. This defeat dropped OLOP to 5th, one point behind Reading FC 'B' who had also only played eleven matches. However, Jan & Co had no match the following week, which enabled Reading FC to open a slightly larger gap. OLOP retained the same personnel for their trip to Kingfisher 'H', who were sitting in 3rd place and took advantage of Kingfisher's lack of a third player to record a 4 - 6 win, Jan beating Gill Bennett but losing to Azaan Ali



9-11 6-11 10-12, Rudresh losing in 4 games to both Gill and Azaan, while Qing beat Gill 11-9 11-6 9-11 13-11 and lost in 5 games to Azaan, Jan & Qing finally winning a Doubles on their 6th attempt, to guarantee the win.

The following week Springfield 'D' were the visitors and, this time, OLOP were the team conceding points as they could only field Qing and Jan. However, Qing recorded a straight set treble while Jan contributed two wins in defeating Colin Jones and Emily Goodall, losing to Chris Taylor 1-11 8-11 11-4 10-12, the final 6 - 4 scoreline thanks to Jan & Qing's defeat of Chris & Colin in the Doubles. On the Doubles front, existing pairings Alona & Jan have played three more times, winning twice, as have Jan & Qing. This means that Alona & Jan are now the top pairing, with a 60% win average, while Jan & Rudresh, who have played together twice, have a 50% win average.


Although, at the end of last year, Reading FC 'B' had only played eight matches, they had earned 53 points and were in third place, one point ahead of Kingfisher 'H'. The final match of 2019 was postponed and will now have to be fitted into the schedule, since the outcome from this rescheduled match may well determine who is promoted. Reading FC therefore started 2020 in 5th place, one point behind Our Lady of Peace 'F', but with two matches in hand. Their first match of the New Year was against another promotion rival, Sonning Common & Peppard 'G', and with both teams probably playing their strongest teams it was a close run affair. Freedom Agindotan narrowly lost the opening set to Melvyn Lovegrove, 4-11 11-8 7-11 11-6 15-17 but Derek Anderson then beat Marko Madzar 11-9 11-4 12-10. Simon Berry then defeated Joe Bull before Derek beat Melvyn 11-8 11-7 8-11 9-11 11-7. The match was tied at 3 - 3 before the opponents won the Doubles, quickly followed by the next two sets. Freedom beat Marko 11-2 14-12 14-12 to ensure a further point for Reading FC in this 4 - 6 defeat.

The following week, the same squad headed to Tidmarsh 'E' where they emerged victorious, having won 0 - 10, with all 6 games finishing 11-9 or more going to Reading FC. Coincidentally, this was the same set of players and Doubles partnership that was responsible for their previous 10 - 0 victory (over Milestone 'C'). Despite this emphatic win, Reading FC remained in 5th place. Sonning Sports 'C' were the next unwitting victims, Stephen Reader beating Harry Edwards in the final set to avoid the whitewash and deny Harry his first treble of the season, the match finishing 9 - 1 with Joe and Freedom recording successive trebles. This result moved Reading FC into 4th place and the following week Joe, Harry and Derek travelled to Kennet Valley Free Church 'B' where they lost 6 - 4, Harry unable to draw the match when he lost the 10th set to Lewis Oke 11-13 8-11 9-11. Derek lost to Steve Christelow, as did Harry, but in winning two sets, stopped Roshan Patel and Lewis from recording maximums.

The following week, Sonning Common & Peppard 'F' were on the receiving end of an 8 - 2 defeat, Derek and Joe both recording further trebles, while Freedom was stopped in his tracks and could only register two wins, after losing the opening set to Mike Casserley 7-11 12-10 11-7 8-11 5-11. Derek & Joe also lost the Doubles, to Julian James & Mike Casserley 14-16 13-15 11-9 8-11. 13 of the 36 games played went to 11-9, or greater. Further vital points were dropped the following week, when Reading FC travelled to Milestone 'C' and drew the match 5 - 5. Freedom won all three and Derek won two, losing to Carl Edlind in 5 games, while Harry took all three opponents to 4 games but lost each time.

Reading FC 'B' played their postponed match against Tidmarsh 'E' while everyone had their "free" week, putting out their strongest squad of Freedom, Derek and Joe, with the end result that they recorded their third 10 - 0 victory and consolidated their 3rd place. However, as is often the case, the scoreline did not reflect the match, with 39 games being played. Steve Andrews was possibly closest to winning a set, finally losing to Derek 12-10 5-11 9-11 14-12 10-12. On the Doubles front, a further seven matches have been played, by three existing partnerships, with four winning performances. Two of these were for Derek & Joe, along with two losses, while the other two were for Freedom & Joe, who are this team's only 100% pair.

When the last Newsletter was published, **Sonning Common & Peppard 'E'** were top of the table, with a 6 point lead. However, their results over the last two months mean that they have been caught and they now find themselves in a pack of three teams vying



for the Divisional Title. The 'E' team have only played five matches this year, since their match against rivals Reading FC 'B' had to be postponed. The same four players - Ian Davenport, David Pearson, Anthony Reeve and Jim Warren - have been selected in 2020. Milestone were the visiting team, for the first match of the year, which resulted in an 8 - 2 victory, with Jim and Anthony both recording maximums, while David won once, beating Tony Hayden 6-11 11-9 11-7 11-13 11-8 but losing to both Carl Edlind and John Evans (11-9 12-14 11-8 6-11 7-11).

The following week Anthony, David and Jim came up against their 'G' team, who fielded Melvyn Lovegrove, Simon Berry and Mark Berry. Anthony, David and Jim could only beat Mark, although Anthony only lost to Melvyn 8-11 11-6 8-11 12-10 3-11 and Jim came even closer, before losing 9-11 9-11 11-9 8-11. A potential minefield was avoided when Anthony, Ian and Jim beat Our Lady of Peace 'F' 8 -2, since Qing Wu was the only OLOP player to win, defeating Anthony in 5 games and Jim in 3 games. The same team then entertained visitors Tidmarsh 'E', who left empty handed following a 10 - 0 loss although a number of games went to 11-9 or more, Steve Andrews particularly unfortunate to lose all three in straight sets.

A fortnight later, Sonning Sports 'C' were the visitors and Anthony, David & Jim were selected to play. Anthony won all three in straight sets, while Jim won all his sets, but was taken to 4 games by John Scott. David again recorded one win, beating Michael Byrne 11-7 11-8 11-13 11-8, but losing to both Stephen Reader (10-12 11-7 8-11 9-11) and John Scott (11-9 8-11 7-11 8-11). On the Doubles front, only two of the three existing partnerships were tried, Anthony & Jim playing together twice and winning both times, while Anthony & Ian played together three times, winning twice. This is the first defeat for this duo, thus losing them their 100% status. However, this pair is still the team's best.

Sonning Common & Peppard 'F' have missed the services of their star player, Derek Wavell, over the course of the last six weeks, as he has been travelling. However, he was available for the last match before Christmas and he made the trip to Milestone 'C', along with Alistair Scott and Julian James. Derek lived up to the hype and won all three, as did Julian so, even though Alistair came up empty, the team had done enough to win 4 - 6. The next match, in early January, was at Our Lady of Peace 'F' and Mike Casserley took Derek's place. However, no-one was able to outwit the OLOP players, although Mike had opportunities before losing to Alona Slobodskoy 12-14 10-12 5-11 and Jan Polnik 9-11 4-11 10-12, Alistair's best chance was probably his 9-11 4-11 11-9 10-12 defeat by Qing Wu, while Julian's contest with Alona was undoubtedly his best chance, eventually losing 8-11 9-11 14-16.

A fortnight later, the same personnel travelled to Kingfisher 'H' who, at this time, were still involved in the promotion battle. Julian and Mike both beat Gill Bennett and Julian also defeated Roger Prew, but Alistair was unable to record a win, although he gave it his all before losing 11-3 9-11 10-12 11-13 to Gill, in the 10th set, which meant that the match was lost 7 - 3. The following week, Springfield 'D' were the visitors and Julian was replaced in the team by Derek Maltby, who was making his first appearance of the season. Mike delivered a Captain's performance, winning all three, and Alistair defeated Colin Jones, but further wins proved too elusive and with Springfield's Chris Taylor and Paul Martin each winning twice, as well as partnering up to win the Doubles, the evening ended in a 4 - 6 defeat.

Mike, Julian and Alistair were back on their travels the following week, this time heading to Reading FC 'B', another of the teams fighting for promotion. The evening started well, with Mike beating Freedom Agindotan 11-7 10-12 7-11 11-8 11-5, in the 1st set, but there was no further joy until the Doubles, when Julian & Mike came out on top in their contest with Derek Anderson & Joe Bull, winning 16-14 15-13 9-11 11-8. Sadly, no further joy afterwards, either and the match ended in an 8 - 2 victory for Reading FC. The following week, the 'F' team were at home to the 'G' team who, at this point, were top of the table. Derek Wavell was back from his travels and Steve Knott celebrated by making his first appearance since early November, with Mike completing the 'F' team's line-up. Facing them were Simon Berry and Melvyn Lovegrove, who had turned up without a third player. Simon & Melvyn didn't drop a set, including the Doubles, and the only game dropped was in the final set, when Melvyn beat Mike 11-6 10-12 12-10 11-9.

Mark lined up in place of Marko, but had no joy against any of his opponents - Anthony Reeve, David Pearson and Jim Warren. Melvyn was back to form, winning all three, although he needed 5 games to beat Anthony, Simon contributed another treble and Simon & Melvyn won the Doubles. All of which meant that they had won 7 - 3. The 'G' team fielded the same players for the visit of Tidmarsh 'E', who had only arrived with two players, namely John Harland and Roger Stevens. Tidmarsh left with a point after John defeated Mark, but Mark recorded another win, in beating Roger 11-6 7-11 11-9 11-8. With Melvyn and Simon both undefeated the final score was 9 - 1.

Marko returned for the next match, an away day excursion to Sonning Sports 'C'. A clean sweep was ruled out after Jude O'Halloran narrowly defeated Marko in his opening set 11-7 12-10 6-11 6-11 12-10.

Interestingly enough, despite these five defeats, the 'F' team remained in 7th place, throughout ! Meanwhile, on the Doubles front. there were five defeats and one win, including two defeats associated with new pairings. Two of the other losses meant that two of the existing pairs (Derek Wavell & Julian and Mike & Julian) now have an average of 50%.

Sonning Common &

Peppard 'G' currently lead the pack at the top of the table, having been in 2nd place in early December. Their match against Springfield 'D' was re-arranged from December to later this month, so all six matches in this report were played in 2020. Simon Berry and Melvyn Lovegrove have played in each match, with Marko Madzar or Mark Berry playing as required. Andy Stone hasn't played since November, even though there was one match when they were a player short, First up was an away trip to Reading FC 'B', when the experienced Marko was their third player. Although Marko didn't win any sets, he was involved in some close games, losing to Derek Anderson 9-11 4-11 10-12 and to Freedom Agindotan 2-11 12-14 12-14. However, Simon & Melvyn retained their undefeated Doubles status, Simon recorded another maximum and Melvyn won two, defeating Freedom 11-4 8-11 11-7 6-11 17-15 and Joe Bull 11-2 11-8 12-10, but losing to Derek 8-11 7-11 11-8 11-9 7-11, which meant that they returned

again recorded three wins, as well as helping Melvyn win the Doubles, Steve & Toby proving more resolute than some opponents, but were finally despatched 12-10 13-15 11-4 11-7. Melvyn was beaten by Steve, losing 4-11 11-9 4-11 11-6 9-11, but got the better of Toby and Jamie, which meant that the 'G' team scraped home with a 6 - 4 win.

Their final match in this Quarter was against their 'F' team. However, Simon and Melvyn turned up without a third player, immediately forfeiting three points, which may be crucial in determining who wins the Division. Of the games played, the 'G' team won every game until the final set, when Mike Casserley came close to stopping Melvyn from recording a maximum, Melvyn eventually winning the set 11-6 10-12 12-10 11-9 and the 'G' team the match 3 - 7. On the Doubles front, Melvyn & Simon have played together in every match and, to date, are still undefeated, although one might claim that they have had a couple of tense moments during these past



months.

Sonning Sports 'C' started this third Quarter in 8th place, two points behind Sonning Common & Peppard 'F' and four points ahead of Springfield 'D', albeit having played one more match than either of these teams. They had no further matches scheduled for December and had to wait until January for their next outing, an away trip to Kingfisher 'H'. Stephen Reader, Jude O'Halloran and Mo Cole undertook the journey and returned with a single point, Mo & Stephen making their Doubles debut to defeat Ania Pytka & Haris Munir and avoid the whitewash. However, the match was much closer than the score-line would indicate, including six 4-game sets and one 5-game set, with Stephen losing to Haris 7-11 2-11 16-18 and Jude losing to Ania 10-12 1-11 9-11.

Following this defeat, Sonning Sports dropped to 9th although this soon changed following the win over their next opponents, Springfield 'D'. Although there were a couple of 5-game sets, Sonning Sports led 5 - 1 by the break, Michael Byrne losing to Paul Martin 3-11 7-11 11-9 6-11 the only blemish on the night, with the final result 9 - 1. This was Stephen's first treble and only Jude's second of the season and, despite dropping a set, two wins equalled Michael's best result to date and meant that the team climbed to 7th in the table. A complete reversal of fortunes awaited Sonning Sports the following week, when they travelled to Reading FC 'B', where they lost 9 - 1, Stephen Reader defeating Harry Edwards in the final set 11-6 11-7 11-8, to avoid the whitewash, John Scott losing in straight sets while Mo Cole took a game off both Joe Bull and Freedom Agindotan.

Sonning Sports then welcomed another promotion hopeful when Sonning Common & Peppard 'G' were the visitors. Jude O'Halloran beat Marko Madzar 11-7 12-10 6-11 6-11 12-10, denying him a treble, and this feat was almost repeated when Michael Byrne narrowly lost 8-11 10-12 9-11 to Melvyn Lovegrove. Mo again took a game off both Melvyn and Marko, but was unable to turn these successes into wins. This 9 - 1 defeat was the fourth consecutive 9 - 1 scoreline (1 win, 3 losses) involving Sonning Sports and left them in 8th place. Sonning Sports travelled to Tidmarsh 'E' the following week, the team being represented by Michael, John Scott and Jude. This was a competitive match, neither team able to gain a sufficient lead, which finally ended 5 - 5, after John won the final set against Steve Andrews 7-11 11-7 11-6 7-11 11-6. In total, five sets went to 5 games, Jude also beating Steve 4-11 11-2 5-11 12-10 11-2 and John beating Roger Stevens 7-11 12-10 13-11 8-11 11-5. John ended the night undefeated, to record his second maximum, also partnering Michael to their first victory as a Doubles pair.

The final match was at Sonning Common & Peppard, where Michael Byrne, John Scott and

Stephen Reader took on the 'E' team, another team aiming for promotion, eventually losing the match 8 -2. The Commoners' Anthony Reeve and Jim Warren proved to be too strong and jointly dropped only one game all evening with their teammate David Pearson being the busiest player, as all three of his sets went to 4 games. David lost his opening set to Stephen 10-12 11-7 8-11 9-11, rallied to beat Michael and was finally beaten by John 11-9 8-11 7-11 8-11. On the Doubles front, five different pairings were tried over the six matches, with two wins and four losses, one of the losses belonging to the new partnership of Jude O'Halloran & Mo Cole. Two different pairs won, Mo Cole & Stephen Reader subsequently losing, while John Scott & Michael Byrne had previously lost one, meaning that these two pairs joined Jude O'Halloran & Stephen Reader on 50%. However, one of the losses was for the previously unbeaten John Scott & Stephen Reader but with an adjusted win percentage of 66% they still rule the roost.

Springfield 'D' are another team battling away at the foot of the table. When the last Newsletter was published they were in 9th place, two points ahead of Tidmarsh. Their last match before Christmas was postponed although this match in hand will not be too beneficial since it is against Sonning Common & Peppard 'G'. However, with the current scoring system, any set win is worth a point and these will be crucial in determining who ends in 11th place, when the dust settles. So, after a longer break than most, Springfield started 2020 in 10th place, facing fellow wooden spoon candidates Tidmarsh 'E'. Despite Chris Taylor recording his first treble, his team mates Tom Berryman and Emily Goodall fared less well and were unable to record any wins, although Tom had a couple of 5-game sets and only lost 9-11 10-12 4-11 to John Harland, which meant that the final score was 3 - 7.

Springfield travelled to Sonning Sports 'C' for their next match, suffering a 9 - 1 defeat, Colin Jones, Paul Martin and Emily finding Michael Byrne, Stephen Reader and Jude O'Halloran almost irrepressible, Paul just getting the better of Michael to avoid the whitewash. For the third match, Springfield welcomed Kennet Valley Free Church 'B', with Colin taking a break and Chris taking the lead. However, Kennet Valley are a harder proposition than in 2019 and left as 8 - 2 winners, Chris losing to Steve Christelow 9-11 4-11 10-12 and Lewis Oke 11-13 10-12 11-6 7-11 but beating Toby Barter over 4 games, while Springfield's other point was courtesy of Paul Martin's 16-14 7-11 11-7 10-12 11-9 win against Toby. Springfield then travelled to Sonning Common & Peppard 'F' where, in the absence of Derek Wavell, Derek Maltby made his debut. Colin won his match against Derek, and Chris and Paul both beat Alistair Scott and Derek, both losing to Mike Casserley, Paul by a 6-11 11-4 11-4 5-11 11-8 scoreline and Chris by an 11-5 15-17 14-12 11-6 scoreline, this result determining who went home undefeated.



All this meant that the Doubles result was crucial, but Chris Taylor & Paul Martin came up trumps, winning as a pair for the first time since October, the outcome meaning that the match was won 4 - 6.

This result enabled Springfield to climb one place, back to 9th, a position which they have retained to the present day. Chris, Emily and Colin re-entered the fray, this time against Milestone 'C'. By the end of the night, they were counting their good fortune that Milestone only arrived with two players, since after an excellent start, when Chris beat Tony Hayden 7-11 11-8 11-8 11-6, they lost every other singles, Chris & Colin partnering up to win the Doubles thus guaranteeing a share of the points. Their final match of the latest tranche was an away trip to Our Lady of Peace 'F' and Springfield fielded the same team as last week. OLOP were unfortunately only able to turn up with two players but as Qing Wu and Jan Polnik were both playing well, only Chris had any joy when he managed to defeat Jan 11-1 11-8 4-11 12-10. However, in losing the crucial Doubles, the match was lost 6 - 4. On the Doubles front, Chris Taylor & Paul Martin played twice more, winning once and losing once, to preserve their 50% average, while Colin Jones & Chris also played together twice, winning for the first time against Milestone to improve their average to 25%. Meanwhile Tom Berryman & Chris remain the team's best Doubles pairing, still unbeaten since they have had no further outing since November.

When the last Newsletter was published, Tidmarsh 'E' were in 10th place, 4 points ahead of Milestone 'C', having played one match less. Now, after a further 7 matches, Tidmarsh are bottom of the table, one point behind Milestone 'C'. They started this journey with an 8 - 2 loss at Kingfisher 'H', with John Harland rested for the first time this Season. Steve Andrews opened for Tidmarsh and lost the first set, to Haris Munir, in four games, the last two 14-12 13-11, before losing another 4-game set this time against Azaan Ali. Steve then paired with Mike Bundy, losing the Doubles 11-8 11-8 9-11 11-8, before taking the scalp of Roger Prew, again in four games. Mike Bundy was equally consistent, albeit less successful, losing his singles in straight sets. Roger Stevens defeated Haris to gain his team's first point and also pushed Azaan close, in his final set, before losing 10-12 13-11 11-9 11-2.

Following this result, Tidmarsh climbed to 9th place, overtaking Springfield 'D', who were their next opponents, in the New Year. For this match, John Harland returned to the fray, replacing Mike Bundy, and he along with Steve and Roger, defeated both Tom Berryman and Emily Goodall but were unable to overcome Chris Taylor, although Steve was tantalisingly close to winning the opening set, losing 11-9 7-11 11-9 6-11 12-10, and Roger pushed Chris all the way, eventually losing 11-9 12-10 12-10. This victory allowed them to climb another place, to 8th. Sadly,

this was their last win and the start of their slow decline to the bottom of the table was set in motion by a 10 - 0 home defeat, at the hands off promotion candidates Reading FC 'B', with Pete Sinclair, Roger Stevens and Mike Bundy losing all six games ending 9-11, or greater, Roger's 12-14 8-11 9-11 loss to Joe Bull possibly the best chance of a point. This match saw Pete make his first and, so far, only appearance for the Season.

The following week saw Tidmarsh playing against another promotion favourite, Sonning Common & Peppard 'G'. To add to their woes, Tidmarsh could only muster John and Roger and they duly lost 9 - 1, John Harland defeating Mark Berry to avoid the whitewash. There was no respite the week after, when Tidmarsh played the third team vying for promotion, namely Sonning Common & Peppard 'E'. Steve, Mike and John succumbed to a second 10 - 0 defeat in the space of a few weeks, Mike Bundy the only player to take a game, in his opening contest against Jim Warren, although Steve only lost to Anthony Reeve 10-12 10-12 6-11 and only lost to Jim Warren 6-11 12-14 10-12. Following these three heavy defeats, Tidmarsh ended back in 10th place. A small up-turn in fortunes followed, with a well earned 5 - 5 draw against Sonning Sports 'C', victory being denied when opponent John Scott beat Steve 7-11 11-7 11-6 7-11 11-6, in the final set. As one would expect this was a close fought affair, with Steve and Roger involved in five 5-game sets.

Although the oldsters from Tidmarsh had been impressed with the youngsters from Kennet Valley Free Church 'B', following their previous visit, no-one expected a 9 - 1 defeat, Steve Andrews managing to beat Roshan Patel, thus avoiding the whitewash, with Mike Bundy and John Harland losing in straight sets, both also losing every 12-10 game. With their postponed match rearranged for this "free" week, Tidmarsh slumped to a 10 - 0 loss against promotion contenders Reading FC 'B', although with 39 games played the match was not as one-sided as the scoreline would suggest. Steve was unlucky not to beat Derek Anderson, losing 12-10 5-11 9-11 14-12 10-12, while Roger Stevens also had opportunities against Joe Bull, eventually losing 3-11 11-9 11-9 5-11 5-11. On the Doubles front, there has been just one further win, albeit for their most prolific pairing John Harland & Steve Andrews but, since they subsequently lost against Sonning Sports and Reading FC, their average is now 43%, slightly below the 50% for Roger Stevens & John. Two new Doubles pairings have also been tried in 2020, Mike Bundy & Steve losing twice while Pete Sinclair & John have lost once.
