Reading regained the Barbara Peisley trophy in emphatic style, gaining the maximum 24 points from the six events.

The Division 1 Senior team kick started Reading's campaign with three 6 - 0 victories over Bracknell, Maidenhead and Newbury respectively. Martin Adams was impressive as always while Yeqin Zeng showed fine form throughout the day, especially in beating Mark Banks 11-9, 18-16, 12-10. Stuart Williams also remained unbeaten, losing just one set in the process.

The Division 1 veterans were disappointed to find that only Bracknell could field a team on the day. Bracknell proved no match for Reading league stars Hari Gehlot and Martin Gunn, while Duncan Groves stepped up as a last minute replacement to win his matches in another 6 - 0 win.

The following Sunday saw Division 2 teams in a more competitive battle, though Maidenhead again failed to field a team, this time in the Seniors. First up for the Seniors were Bracknell. A surprise change in the order meant that

A 12-10 loss in the fifth meant that the spoils were shared, despite the Bracknell team being one man short.

Reading recorded a 4 - 2 win in their second and final match against a strong looking Newbury team. The highlights were a straight sets win by Csaba Pall over Steve Murgatroyd and a fine 3 - 2 win by Andrew Parker over Paul Rattue. The result of the Newbury v Bracknell match meant that Reading topped the group.

The Division 2 veterans represented by Gary Morgan, Neil Hurford and Pete Bradley, outplayed all their opponents, losing only one singles match in the process.

For the final Sunday, **Reading selected Dan Moses, Danny Ricks and Eduard Caliman** in the Division 3 Senior team and proved too strong for their opposition, recording 5-1 wins over Bracknell and Maidenhead and 6-0 over

Newbury. Both Dan and Ed finished the day unbeaten.

The Division 3 veterans swept past their first two opponents but were left with a tricky match against Newbury to win their minileague. Henryk Ciechanovicz lost his first singles of the day in a five setter against Andy Barnes then Newbury went two nil up after Tony Brown beat Mike Aistrop. Barry

Carter led the fight back by beating Denise Weller in straight sets, then Henryk levelled the match by beating Tony Brown. Barry lost the fifth rubber to Andy Barnes but Mike Aistrop made sure of the points by defeating Denise in five sets despite being two down. Thanks to all the Reading players for their participation, including a few who had to step in quite late in the day to help out.





## Team Handicap Competition 2015-16





team during this period. He started off well with a full score in the 6-4 win over Birch Copse 'B', but then failed to score in the 4-6 reverse against Tile Meths 'D'. 

The third evening of Division One matches on the 29th saw the Jaguars extend their unbeaten run with a 7 - 3


win against the Raiders with Bill Hayden again winning all 3 sets. The Strikers overcame the Tigers 8 - 2.
