appearances. They have also been more clinical against the lower-placed sides and could be at the top before long if this trend continues.

Next in **fourth** is **Kingfisher 'A'** who have met with strong opposition and, with SC&P 'A' still to face, have already lost some ground on those above, spurning 17 points and two losses in the first five matches, compared to a total of 24 and all victories across last season (I promised no comparative stats - my bad!). The regular trio so far has been Martin Adams, Hari Gehlot and Dmitry Khakhamov with Rishaan

Sawant adding a useful maximum against Tilehurst RBL. We'll be plodding on as per usual in an attempt to climb the table and challenge for our defence.

Currently **fifth** is **Kingfisher E**. This squad largely consists of former division two players but they are certainly holding their own as they enjoyed an opening set of three victories. Shashwat Somani is unbeaten after outstanding maximums against both Tilehurst RBL and Sonning Common & Peppard 'B', a feat almost matched by Adrian Cretu (but for Danny Dockree) who sits on an impressive 78% so far. Their other consistently turned-out players have been Wayne

Alleyne and captain Clive Gold, both with identical match stats (4/9) and contributed two to their 6-4 victory over Sonning Sports 'A' but will have sterner opposition to follow. Gordon Cho also looks dangerous as on his Reading division 1 debut he took ends off both Julian Telford and Jordan Huang.

Next in **sixth** is **Sonning Common & Peppard 'B'**. Danny Dockree and Jon Abbott have helped to secure their midtable status with Danny taking three against second place Kingfisher 'F' (something only Dan Moses has managed thus far) and Jon following up a maximum against Sonning Sports 'A' with a double against Dale Ballard and Antony Baker of

Tidmarsh. Tim Raby and Angus Jones have already contributed. Tom Astle has only played the one match but made his appearance felt as his consistency was too much for Dmitry Khakhamov and he ran out a 3-0 winner.



**Seventh** (but only I believe by way of S coming before T or possibly a worse ends average than SC&P 'B') sees **Tidmarsh 'A'**. They have endured several close encounters scoring 5,4,6,4 (and we'll forgive them the 0 against KFB). Robert McMillan is a welcome addition to this division and has started well with five out of nine. Antony Baker has contributed in four of his five appearances but never with more than one win. Lee Calcutt on the other hand gained a nice maximum in his sole appearance against SC&P 'B'. Captain Duncan Groves and Dale Ballard have each made two appearances chalking up five singles points between them.

Sonning Sports 'A' are eighth. But at full strength they are





not the eighth best team and will undoubtedly have a say in the final outcome. We welcome Robert Hansell to the Reading League, yet another Top 100 National player making his debut. He eased past Hari in his sole appearance thus far and when the stars align and he teams up with Dave Croucher (it hasn't happened yet) they will be a severe test for the very best teams and will ease above the lower positions. They are yet to record an overall match win despite Paul Savage, Nick Sears and Graham Diplock all contributing to the tally. Bob Woodmansee is such a nice bloke.

In **ninth** position is **Tilehurst RBL 'A'**. I feel a transfer is on the cards as Kate Maksimenko, who is registered for their division two B team, has already played up three times and comfortably outscored her division one colleagues helping them to two match wins against Tidmarsh and Sonning Sports, where she scored scintillating maximums. Despite a 3-0 victory for Keith Winter over Dmitry, he has struggled to convert, losing no less than five five-gamers! It has also been a frustrating one for Jon Willis thus far, spurning several match points on the same evening over Dmitry and just the single victory to date. Marc Brent also has a sole singles point and may not be available for too many more matches as I understand it, which will no doubt expedite Kate's transfer.

Consistently in the top half in previous seasons (there I go comparing again!) Kingfisher 'C' find themselves in tenth position. On the plus side they have games in hand and have negotiated three of the big four. They managed to notch up a useful win over Tidmarsh where both Nigel

Keedy and new signing Pallavi Urankar managed impressive triples, the latter all requiring a fifth game. I expect Phil Mead and his other colleagues Harry Yeates (another new

signing) and Alan Cummings to improve their averages and climb up to mid-table in the run-up to Christmas.

Propping up the table in **eleventh**, yet brimming with talent, is **Kingfisher 'D'**. To date, Mike Childs is their only player to score more than one in an evening as he masterfully negotiated a Tidmarsh trio. Along with Simon Rowland they have been unlucky to lose several fifth gamers, including Simon pushing KFB players Julian Telford and Jordan Huang to deuce in the fifth. However he recovered impressively to ease past Graham Mendick on the same night. Like KFC they have already faced three of the top 4 teams and have played fewer matches. So I expect a significant recovery from Mike, Simon, Georgi Ivanov, Tak Chan and Jazz Dhillon.

Kingfisher 'I' - newly promoted Kingfisher 'I' have been the surprise package so far and have had three wins and a draw and have the equal best points difference in the league table. They have three players averaging around 60% and over with Akeel Mir having a top average of 89%. They are possibly in a slightly false position as they have played teams in the bottom half and a Springfield 'A' team that did not have its strongest team out but having said that it looks like they will have a good season and they could easily contest the promotion places.

#### Prediction – 2<sup>nd</sup>

Best Recent Performance – Akeel Mir with an impressive three straight maximum against Springfield 'A`

**SC&P** 'C'are looking to bounce straight back after their relegation from Division 1. They have lost Brain Meheux but have signed Holly Ranson who has returned to playing after quite a long period out of the game. They are a strong team and its likely that their four players will all average over 50% and the unbeaten Simon Berry is unlikely to lose many matches at all. So, they are favourites for the title but whether they win it may depend on how often Simon plays.

**Tidmarsh 'B'** have lost their best player from last season, something which also happened the year before. Consequently, they may find things a bit difficult this year but with a team of experienced players at this level they should end up in a mid-table position. Bill Stamatiou, on 83%, and Simon Barter have both had good starts to the season but the rest of their squad have had slow starts. All but one of their matches have been very close with the one exception being a 9-1 defeat against OLOP 'A'

Prediction - 7<sup>th</sup>

Best Recent Performance – Bill Stamatiou recovering from two games down to beat Glen Armashula 12-10 in the fifth

**Tidmarsh 'C**' had lots of injury and other player availability issues last year and hopefully the same will not occur this time around. They have had a mixed start to the season with a big win and a couple of defeats but



if their players perform to a similar level to the second half of last season they should do OK. Sayali Bendkhale has their best average of 67% but everyone else has chipped in with wins so I would expect their results to improve.

Prediction - 5<sup>th</sup>

Best Recent Performance – Simon Craig recovering from two games down to beat your DFS 11-8 in the fifth

Kingfisher 'H' have had a surprisingly difficult start to the season and they find themselves in the bottom two with a minus 14 points difference. However, apart from a heavy defeat against SC&P 'C' all of their matches have been close which suggests they have a chance of moving up the table. Glen Armashula is a good player at this level and is on 78% and Nikhil Kulkarni has had a good start to the season but the rest of their squad have

struggled a bit. With six players how well they will do may depend on team selection and in particular how often Glen plays.

Kingfisher 'G' were tipped by me as being promotion candidates (sorry Andrew) but they have had a very difficult start to the season, partly due to player availability issues. Ian Clothier looks like a useful signing but with their highest player average only being 44% they will need to show some improved form to claw back the points they have lost



# DIVISION THREE by Huzeyfe Borazan

Velcome everyone to the first edition of the Division 3 newsletter of the 2024-25 season, a battleground with its fair share of upsets, near-misses, and table tennis drama to rival any soap opera. We're only a handful of matches in, but we're well into the season. From surprise wins to heartbreaking losses, it's shaping up to be an absolute thriller! As always, some teams are contending for promotion, while others are just trying to keep their heads above water.

As is our tradition, let's take a closer look at how the teams are performing and try to predict where they might end up when the dust settles. #### 1. Our Lady Of Peace 'C' - Leading the Pack!

**OLOP 'C'** is last year's OLOP 'B' and they have been playing with the same core team for a long time. They hit the ground running with an unbeaten record and are making quite a name for themselves as the ones to beat this season. With a rock-solid roster, including new addition, their top players like Daniel Dzieciol, who's smashing his way through opponents with an impressive 86.67% win rate, OLOP 'C' are proving they've got the depth to last. Their consistency has been the secret to their success, and every other team will need to bring their A-game to knock these guys off the top spot.

Prediction: OLOP 'C' are heavy favourites for the title if they keep up their form. A top finish and possible promotion are very much on the cards. 1st place finish...

## 2. Pangbourne WMC - Close Contenders

After a brief period at Division 2 they are back to

Division 3 this year. Nipping at OLOP 'C' s heels, Pangbourne WMC have shown they're more than capable of mixing it with the best. **John Simmonds** maintains a perfect 100% win rate, and **Clive Taylor** isn't far behind with 80%, making this a formidable duo. They took a slight knock after losing to OLOP 'C', but

they've got the firepower to stay in the top spots. The question is whether they can maintain their momentum or if they'll fall behind under pressure from the rest. Their biggest disadvantage was they did

only have 3 players with the result that they had to forfeit some of the games. However, this year they have **Aleksey Mokhov** which can make a difference.

**Prediction:** With their current form, Pangbourne should be pushing for promotion. If Aleksey and Leroy contribute more, they can pursue the title like they did two years ago. **2nd place finish.** 

## 3. Sonning Common and Peppard 'D' – Strong Starters

Sonning Common and Peppard 'D' have shown flashes of brilliance this season. With **Jeremy Willis** in top form and **Ian Davenport** delivering solid performances, they've climbed into third place. Their victory against Kingfisher 'J' showed they are serious, though they've had some inconsistent performances, which could cost them dearly if not addressed. A top-three finish is achievable, and if they stay consistent and avoid losing points to lower-ranked teams, they can push for promotion.

Prediction: They've got the talent to stick around the top, but keeping consistency is key. Look for SC&P 'D' to round out the top three by season's end. 3rd place finish.

#### 4. Sonning Sports 'B' - Aiming High

**Sonning Sports 'B'** has a solid all-round team with a deep player pool as reserves. They have been providing a good exhibition with some close wins and strong individual performances, especially from **Tim Challender** and **Brett Hastings**. They're comfortably in fourth right now, but they'll need to keep up the wins against mid-table teams to hold their spot. They could even push for third place with the right mix of grit and determination, especially when **Grant Baartman** chips in more.

Prediction: Sonning Sports 'B' have the potential to secure a top-four finish, but consistency against mid-level teams will be key. 4th place finish.





## 5. Our Lady Of Peace 'D' – Mid-Table Marvels

**OLOP 'D'** has been the most consistent team in recent years. It's always enjoyable to play against them. They have had a solid, if not spectacular, start

Though they've managed to avoid any heavy defeats, they'll need to step things up if they want to break into the top four. For now, they seem set for a comfortable mid-table finish, neither challenging for promotion nor facing relegation concerns.

Prediction: Mid-table security seems likely, with potential to rise if they secure some key wins. 5th place finish.

#### 6. Kingfisher 'J' – A Mixed Bag

**Kingfisher 'J'** is a newly formed team with new players who are experiencing their first season. This explains why the journey and the results so far have been a bit of a rollercoaster for Kingfisher 'J'. **Neil Abbott**'s excellent form has given the team some much-needed wins, but overall consistency is lacking. They've got the talent to stick in the middle of the table, but whether they move up or down might just come down to the form of a couple of key players. Right now, they look set to hover around mid-table.

Prediction: With some grit and a little luck, they could climb a place or two, but for now, they seem likely to hold steady. 8th place finish.

## 7. Tilehurst Methodists 'A' – Looking to Climb

**Tilehurst Methodists 'A'** are struggling to find their feet after dropping down from Division 2. Last year they lost their best player and captain and this season **Phil Jones** and **Jes Eassom** have been doing their best to keep the team floating, but a lack of support from the squad is holding them back. If they can rally and get the full team firing, they've got a chance to push up the table, but right now, they're looking at a mid-to-lower table finish.

**Prediction:** A mid-table spot is likely unless they can squeeze out a few wins in tougher matches. **7th** place finish.

#### 8. Sonning Sports 'C' - Battling the Odds

It's been a tough run so far for Sonning Sports 'C', but there are signs of hope. Last season's flash player James Miller has been a beacon of consistency, but the rest of the squad needs to step up if they want to avoid relegation. **Cris Reynold**'s contribution in doubles is important, and it's also required in individual sets. Their upcoming matches are crucial, and any points they can scrape together could make all the difference.

**Prediction:** Unless they find their form, they're in for a long season near the bottom of the table. **9th place finish.** 

#### 9. Tidmarsh 'D' - Fighting to Climb Up

Tidmarsh 'D' has been one of the most consistent and formidable teams in Division 3 in recent years. However, this season, despite their best efforts, they appear vulnerable. **Ray Webb** and **Terry Hardie** have shown glimmers of promise, but a few unfortunate losses have left them further from their expected performance. To climb the ranks, they will need strong results against teams lower in the standings. With a match in hand, they are certainly capable of achieving this.

## 11. Sonning Common and Peppard 'E' – Struggling for Points

**SC&P 'E'** has had a rocky start to life in Division 3. **Gerry Bacon** has been the standout performer, but it's not been enough to keep them from sinking towards the bottom. If the rest of the squad doesn't find their form soon, they'll be facing the relegation.

Prediction: SC&P 'E' are likely to end up in the bottom two unless they can turn things around. 11th place finish.

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So, there you have it! Our Lady Of Peace 'C' look set to be the team to beat, but Pangbourne WMC and Sonning Common and Peppard 'D' aren't about to let

them sail to victory without a fight. Meanwhile, teams like **Tilehurst Methodists 'B'** and **Sonning Common and Peppard 'E'** are in a race against time to avoid the dreaded drop, clinging to every point they can get in a fight for survival.


