DIVISION ONE by Martin Adams


ell, that's a wrap for another season. I hope you enjoyed it as much as I did. After entering results for 110 matches,

With the match score now at one apiece, next up was Leroy Wilson and Muharrem Aydin, Leroy started the game two points down but pulled back to win 21-17 and 21-19. Clive then played Huzeyfe, and won this one 21-18 and 21-9. John then met Aydin, with Aydin getting a 5 point start, John took this one 21-19 and 21-15.


The match score was now 4 - 1 to

ell, what a season this has turned out to be with the second promotion and relegation places not decided until the final match of the season which took place just before Easter. Over twenty draws, almost thirty 6 - 4's, no 10 - 0's and hardly any 9 - 1's with the division winners averaging 6.2 points per match and the bottom team 3.7, plus with the team in the second relegation place going down averaging 4.4. There has probably never been such another closely fought season for many years and maybe never at all.

As had looked likely for a while SC&P
'D' ended up as worthy champions winning the division by eleven points. The runners
up spot was undecided until the last set of the final match
which did not take place until almost two weeks after the

regular season finished after a postponement due to Covid. In this match some sets had to be played out of order so it all came down to the doubles, which was played at the end, and SC&P 'C` won it after a scare in the first game to secure the 6-4 win they needed. The four points gained were enough to keep Tilehurst Meths 'A` up as well.

SC&P 'D' finished the season with two good wins and three draws which was easily good enough to ensure they stayed comfortably clear in top spot.Danny Dockree had a great season and kept up his excellent form throughout finishing top of the divisional averages on 92%, although he did suffer close defeats to Kate Maksimenko and Roger Pritchard in the last few matches. Jonathan Abbott finished the season strongly to boost his average to 70% and Mark Jones and Angus Jones gave them good support.

Hopefully they will give a good account of themselves in Division 1 next season.

Previous Prediction – 1st Final Position 1st
Best Recent Performance –Jonathan Abbott with very good maximums against promotion rivals SC&P'C` and Tidmarsh'B` in the last few matches.

SC&P 'C' had a lot of very close results towards the end of the season and this, plus a defeat against their D team allowed some of the teams behind them into the race for second spot. In the end it all came down to the two re-arranged matches they had to play after the regular season finished, with them needing twelve points to clinch the runners up spot. In the first of these they secured half the points needed with a 6 - 4 win over Tilehurst RBL 'B' and that left them needing the same score against Tilehurst Meths 'A'. In this match some sets had to be played out of order to allow Eric Van Looy to leave early and in one of them Brian Meheux put in a fantastic performance to beat Eric in four. Despite this SC&P 'C' found themselves 3 – 1 down, they got back to 4 – 4 but Malcolm Gregory was 4-8 down to Phil Jones in the fifth before winning 11-

9. A win in the doubles then gave them the sixth point they needed.

They have used the same three players throughout the season and all of them have had good spells and have had times when wins have been more difficult to find. Skipper Nigel Maltby and Malcolm Gregory have ended up with identical averages of 59% and Brian Meheux has given them good support to end up at 45%

Previous Prediction – 2nd Final Position 2nd Best Recent Performance- Brian Meheux with a great win in four against Eric Van Looy in the promotion/relegation decider, winning the set on his fifth set point.

OLOP 'B` had a fine end to the season with a draw against the league champions followed by two big wins in their last two matches. These results propelled them up to second place with only SC&P 'C`, who had two rearranged matches to play, able to catch them. Darek


Interesting facts:
