

The March of the High Veterans by Derek Wavell

igh Veterans' is my phrase for the over-80s in table tennis. Officially the oldest category is 'senior veterans', which refers to the over-60s. But now high veterans seem to be proliferating like rabbits.

Bob Woodmansee started me off on this tack, by writing that his friend Dave West had now reached 80 - and was he the last 80-year-old still playing? Well, no. I had done an article in 2008 about three other 80-year-olds at that time - Gordon Ayres, Dave Jones and Taffy Thomas - and it turns out that all three are still playing. And at least two more current players have seen 80 since then - Mike Dorrington and John Harland. Here are some details about these six remarkable men, in whose footsteps we must certainly try to follow!




DAVE WEST

Dave West, of Sonning Sports 'B', was 80 in September. Dave first played in the Reading League in 1948 - and represented Robert Cort before joining his present club more than 20 years ago.

He has played in as many as 9 matches so far this season, in Division Six.

Mike Dorrington, who is now 81, plays for Kingfisher 'F' in Division Two. He has played since 1946 and with long pimples on both sides ever since those came out. He is always saying he is too old for table tennis - but never quits. One year he had a heart attack, and when he came home from hospital, could only crawl upstairs on hands and knees. But the lure of the Kingfisher Grand Prix had him on his feet, and soon the sport cured him.



hospital with heart failure - but is now out, and will soon be at work on a new active cure!



MIKE DORRINGTON

John Harland is 80 years old and plays for Tidmarsh 'E' in Division Five. In fact he helped found Tidmarsh TT club in 1954. and he has played as high as Div He has a reputation as a 3. resourceful and skillful exponent of the game, who never gives up. In fact his average is 100% at the moment - though that is only on the strength of one match. With 8 players registered for the team, there is a lack of matches to go round!

Gordon Ayres is now 84 and plays for the BBC Club in Division 6. He started off with the Woodlands Club in Tilehurst, in about 1944 according to his son lan who now plays in Division 3 for Sonning Common Peppard.

Gordon played for a number of clubs until his longtime employer the BBC started up a team in the early 90s and he joined that.



At Woodlands he played as high as division three and for other clubs mostly division 4, 5 and then 6. For the BBC he regularly played in the Maidenhead league too. In the past he has served as divisional secretary, and has had positions on club committees.

Dave Jones is another 84-year-old, who now plays for

Tilehurst Methodists 'D' in Division Six.

He too played Woodlands in 1965, and progressed up to Division One.. Later he played for NIRD before joining Tilehurst Meths in about 2000.

Like Gordon Ayres, he passed on his enthusiasm for table tennis to another generation. All his four daughter took up the sport - Elaine, Alison, Deborah and Carole.



Carole (Chard) until recently played for Kingfisher in Division Two.

In 1989-90, Dave won the John Freeman trophy for a 100% average throughout the season.

Colin 'Taffy' Thomas is 84 too. He has mostly played in

the lower divisions at Pangbourne WMC; however, at present that club only has a team in Division 3 so, though he is a registered player for them, he plays only in the Team Handicap. However, he is described as a 'mainstay' player of the club, coming along to all home games and adding greatly to the cheery atmosphere.

Taffy only took up the game in 1963, playing originally for Purley, and then

Kentwood and Tidmarsh before Pangbourne WMC 'B' in Division 5. He is a great ambassador for the sport.

DIVISION ONE by Malcolm Gregory



And here's a bit of insight into the world of Division One table tennis. Our team was on the end of a damn good thrashing from one of the Kingfisher teams. Having finished by 10.30 pm, me and Keefy decided to pop down the pub for a swift half. The oppos declined an invitation to join us. Two of them, quite reasonably, said they had work the next day and needed to get back. But the third person declined because he was going down to Kingfisher for a knock up!! Since the last report, Kingfisher 'A' suffered their first loss 4 – 6 at home to Polish. This only goes to prove if Martin Adams was to play more regularly, Polish would be in con-





tention for the title. The crunch game of this particular evening was a glittering encounter between Martin and Hari Gehlot, which effectively decided the match. Martin ran out a 11-4 5-11 11-13 11-9 11- 9 winner. A good doubles win for Polish and great backup from Steve Dobbins and Graham

Diplock gave Polish the win, which keeps the top of the table looking interesting!! Polish are clearly well capable of upsetting any team in the division if Martin plays.

At the time of writing, OLOP 'A' top the table by 2 points but they have played one more game than second-placed Kingfisher. OLOP's only loss this season was at the hands of Kingfisher 'A' where once again, the stand-out game of the evening involved

Mr Hari Gehlot against Daniel Moses. Daniel came back from 2 games down and did just enough to run out the winner in another 5 game thriller: 5-11, 12-14, 11-3, 13-11, 12-10. However Mike Childs was the only other winner for OLOP that evening as Hari and Elson Costa with 2 sets apiece and Mark Banks chipping in with one plus a good doubles win, saw Kingfisher home 6 - 4. Incidentally, having

done a very thorough and detailed analysis of how many games Daniel Moses has won by an 11-9 scoreline or "more" (e.g. 12-10, 13-11 etc) I would now like to announce the results: Well, it's quite a lot.

Tidmarsh are lurking in 3rd place and are another team which is capable of beating the best. In Sander De Riemer they have found not only a very talented ping pong player but also a very pleasant gentleman from whom it is a pleasure to receive a damn good thrashing. And I'm speaking from personal experience here. Having lost to both Kingfisher 'A' and Polish earlier in the season, Tidmarsh's most recent encounter with one of the top teams was a loss to OLOP 'A' 7 - 3. Top billing in this match was the contest between Sander and Daniel Moses which Daniel won 11-7, 14-12, 11-13, 6-11, 12-10. Tidmarsh have good strength in depth. Peter Matthews and John Barclay are both featuring strongly in the averages and it seems as though the team just needs to win a few more of the close games and they'll be right up there. . Their losses to Kingfisher 'A' and Polish were both 6 - 4. Like I said, they are capable of upsetting the teams at the top. Watch this space.

OLOP 'B' currently head the mid table section of Division 1. A recent result shows that they are good value for this position: a 7 - 3 victory over an - albeit Adamsless - Polish. Krasi Ivanov was the star of this show with a brilliant 3straight maximum against a slightly weaker Polish team consisting of Steve Dobbins, Nicky Heaps and Andy Yon. Krasi received good support from his team mates Bradley King (2) and John Millward. A four set doubles win completed a good looking team performance.

Polish have featured quite strongly in this report so far. They have a rather large squad (6 players!!) and should they find a way of playing suitably strong teams in their remaining fixtures, they could be unbeaten in the second half. Obviously this is strongly dependent on the availability of a certain Mr. Adams. With the likes of Steve Dobbins, Nicky Heaps and Richard Rosinski to call upon they definitely have an opportunity to climb up the table but it's probably too late for them to make a title challenge.

YMCA sit comfortably in mid table. A recent 9 – 1 defeat at the hands of OLOP 'A' saw our favourite old veteran

Dave Streak beat Ian Cole 3 straight to keep his team from a whitewash. And by all accounts, Dave achieved this even though he is suffering from a hernia! Well done Dave old boy!! Apparently (so Pete Bradley tells me) Dave got his hernia laughing at Keith Winters' haircut. When I saw Keith, I nearly got one as well! But seriously, after a rather inauspicious start to the season the YMCA result against Polish made me sit up and take notice. Keith went out there and beat Richard Rosinski, Steve Dobbins and Graham Diplock to record a fabulous maximum and help his team to a fine 6 - 4 victory which included 2 wins for Neil Hurford and a good doubles win for Keith and Neil over Graham and Steve.

Daniel McTiernan is having a tidy season with **OLOP 'C'**. In their narrow 6 - 4 defeat to Tidmarsh he scored a good double over John Barclay and Antony Baker as did the other Danny - of the Ricks variety. Both Danny's succumbed to the exotic Sander De Riemer which is nothing to be ashamed of. The big surprise with this team for me is the continued struggle which Neil Bird seems to be having after such a fantastic season in division two last year when he swept aside all before him. He's still too good for yours truly however, as are most people in this division!! The

this point.



DIVISION TWO by Barry Carter




Week 7:

DIVISION THREE by Nick Lean

e are now past the half-way point of the season and hand could crash the party. the Division 3 table is already showing several teams settling into a position that I

believe they will occupy for a further 3 months.

There follows a summary of the current status of all teams in this Division, but remember there are full details of all fixtures, results and match scorecards on the new RDTTA website.

Top of the tree are Milestone 'A' who have beaten all comers to complete the first half of the season with a 100% record. They started the second half with a 9 - 1 win at Tilehurst Meths 'B' and in doing so broke their own Club record with a marvellous run of 10 wins from 10 matches. The critical fixture for them was their last match of the first half, against unbeaten Polish 'B'. For this clash of the titans Polish fielded their strongest team, but left licking their wounds having suffered their first defeat of the season. John Tucker started the match by removing Jacek Borysiuk's 100% record and went on to win all three. Tucker's heavy backspin serves, sound defence and counter top-spins were too much for the attacking left han-

Robin Benwell then beat Jacek der. Krzyzanowski in 3 straight and also went on to defeat the previously unbeaten Borysiuk to record his own maximum. John Crosfield also beat Darek Kaminski over five games to put Milestone 3 - 0 up on the way to an impressive 7 - 3 win.

That result puts Milestone in an almost unassailable position as far as promotion is concerned, and until they face Polish again it seems a fair bet they will extend their run for several more matches, especially as they have their captain waiting in the wings who must be itching to play again.

Polish 'B' are clear in second place and I don't see anyone preventing them from gaining promotion come the end of the season. The two Jaceks are the mainstay of their team and recently helped the team secure wins over Tilehurst Meths 'B', Kingfisher 'G' and Springfield, but they were evidently surprised and I believe shocked by their defeat at Milestone. They have started the second half of the season as they had the first, with a draw against OLOP 'E', who are currently

Borysiuk was made to battle hard by Josh Gallen and Sam Liu who both took him to a deciding fifth game, while their #2 Jacek Krzyzanowski had an off night losing all three of his singles contests. But if they can field the two Jaceks for most of their remaining matches, this Polish team should end the season where they are now, in second place.

Third place seems to be a fight between OLOP 'E' and Tilehurst Methodists 'A', although OLOP 'F', with matches in

In their six most recent matches OLOP 'E' have won 3. drawn 1. lost 1 and for good measure postponed one match. They comprehensively defeated Springfield 'A' 10 - 0 then despite a brave fight from Pangbourne, who were only able to field two players, won by the narrowest of margins. But they went down 4 - 6 at Tilehurst Meths 'A' where the result was decided by the doubles which Tilehurst won in the deciding set. OLOP 'E' bounced back with a comfortable 8 - 2 win over Sonning C&P 'D'

Treadgold and the two of them teamed up to win the ever critical doubles.


OLOP 'F' have played just 3 matches in the last 6 weeks, with two of their fixtures unfulfilled due to the opposition being unavailable. Their match with Kingfisher 'G' also didn't take place on the scheduled date due to the visiting team being unaware of OLOP's late change of home night & team placing which means the Handbook is wrong and so were their diaries.

(All team captains should already be aware: OLOP 'F' have moved from Position 9 to 11 and their home night is now Wednesday NOT Tuesday. The information on the website is correct.)

This match was re-arranged, but OLOP's Pat Daniels hadn't realised he had fixed it for a date on which they already had a match - so his team played two matches on the same night, switching between their opponents on two tables!!! Despite this marathon feat, OLOP 'F' came close to being the first team to take points off Milestone, as new signing Steve Miller and Harry Brough won two each, while Pat Daniels lost all three of his singles contests in the deciding game, as did Harry Brough against Robin Benwell, so they lost out 4 - 6.

Amazingly, in the parallel match with Kingfisher 'G' Pat Daniels also lost all three of his singles contests in the deciding game, which included losing out 15-17 in the fifth to Dave Duncan. Fortunately Steve Miller is no "Joker" (does anyone get the reference?) and he won all three of his singles which, with one win from Harry Brough and the doubles helped them to a draw. Surely Pat has set some kind of record, not just to play two matches on the same night (even I have done that, in my youth) but to lose all 6 contests in the deciding game! Harry Brough and Steve Miller both hit maximums as they left Springfield with a 9-1 win.

Two teams have yet to win a match and find themselves at the bottom of the table - Pangbourne and Tilehurst Methodists 'B'. Neither team is that far short of mid-table mediocrity, but they will need to beat at least one of the



teams immediately above them if they are to put in a challenge for safety.

Pangbourne have played only 3 matches since the previous Newsletter, but lost them all. They lost 4 - 6 at OLOP 'E' despite a brave fight-back and only being able to field two players. Tilehurst Meths 'B' have also played just 3 recent matches and lost them all. At Polish only Melvin Lovegrove provided some resistance for the visitors, winning two and narrowly losing out to Jacek Borysiuk in the deciding game of their contest. In a bid to avoid relegation they put up a fight in the middle of their match at Kingfisher 'G' as Richard Lownsborough battled to beat Dave Duncan over five games and Melvin beat Eric Holmes in five. But Richard and Melvyn both lost out in the fifth game of their contests with Allen Pack and Eric Holmes respectively and they eventually lost the match 8 - 2. The second half of the season started with a visit from Milestone which ended badly as the only victory was in the doubles.

This leaves three teams who are fighting for nothing but their pride, unless they come a cropper against one (or both) of the dog-fighting duo.

Kingfisher 'G' continued their sequence of matches with 6 - 4 or 4 - 6 results with the narrowest of defeats to Polish where they came close to taking a surprise point. Allen Pack won two while Carol Byers and Eric Holmes won one apiece, but Eric and Carol both lost out to Jacek Krzyzanowski in the deciding game of their matches with him and they lost the doubles 9-11 in the fifth. In the marathon night at OLOP 'F' Eric Holmes and Dave Duncan won two apiece with Allen winning one to get them a point in what was surely an opportunity to take both points from tiring opponents. They finished the half with two comprehensive 8 - 2 wins over the bottom teams, the points from which have moved them up to 5th place in the table. Allen

took a maximum from the visit of Tilehurst Meths 'B' while Dave won all three at Pangbourne.

Springfield 'A' have dropped from 3rd place to 7th having endured 5 defeats in a row. They were whitewashed by the youngsters of OLOP 'E', then a below-strength team (missing Phil Burke) went down 2 - 8 at home to Tilehurst 'A' despite two wins for Des Hele. Phil returned to win two in their match at Sonning C&P, but Seth Martin picked up the only other win in a 3 - 7 defeat. Phil's win over Pat Daniels was the only one for the hosts as OLOP 'F' went away 9 - 1 winners and he won 2 more at Polish where they lost 3 - 7.

Sonning C&P 'D' are still not clear of the threat of relegation despite picking up 3 points from their last four matches. Jon Abbott had the only win when SC&P lost 1 - 9 at Milestone, but there was an excellent treble from Mark Corbett, plus two wins for Jon and one for Paul Treadgold when the team recorded their first win of the season 7 - 3 over Springfield. Another defeat this time at OLOP 'E' saw Paul & Mark win one each, while Jon suffered his only duck of the season to date. In their last match of the year SC&P won a valuable point in a hard fought draw with Tilehurst 'A' as Mark and Jon won two each with Paul Treadgold winning one and only losing out 8-11 in the fifth to John Virgo. **Doubles**

The team with the best doubles record are Polish 'B' with 9/10 and they have the best doubles pairing in their Jaceks, Krzyzanowski and Borysiuk who have won 8/8. While there are other pairings with a 100% record (Virgo & Rowland 3/3) the next best doubles pairing is Milestone's Benwell & Tucker with 8/9. (See the website for further details)

Six scheduled matches have not been played - I have emailed the relevant team captains to ask that they are rearranged as soon as possible.

The final word

My thanks to those of you who have been emailing a scanned version of the scorecards to me. This method is working well and quickly gets the results onto the website for everyone to see.

One request though - please could everyone ensure the scorecards are fully completed, with all scores clearly written and names of doubles pairings included (or "1 & 3" will do). All team captains should check the scorecard before they sign it - including the captain of the away team.



That team is **Springfield 'B'** who have not only won those matches but have won them emphatically, winning 47 sets against 13 lost.



home 6 - 4 in their inter-club clash with the 'D' team, Grant scoring three, Kris two and Stephen one. Another promotion clash was won 8 - 2 at Tidmarsh 'E', this time Kris was the maximum man claiming the scalp of Dave Reynolds, and he was ably supported by braces from Grant & Steve. They made heavy weather of a two-man OLOP 'H' side winning 6 - 4 thanks to single wins from Stephen & Grant who crucially teamed up to win the doubles. SC&P 'E' (1 - 9) and Polish 'D' (2 - 8) brought them down to earth with a bump. Dave Reynolds beat Grant and Stephen of Polish 'C', captain Bob Sunerton beat Derek of SC&P 'E', Steve Andrews and John Liddle both beat Szymon of Polish 'D'.

Into the relegation dogfight and **Birch Copse 'B'** are surprisingly as high as seventh. After a run of four defeats their one win since last time was a 7-3 win against two-man Milestone 'B', Duncan Abbott winning his two and Andy Cook and captain Melanie Griffiths both beat John Simpson. Andy won his first set of the season against Linda Davis of Post Office 'B' straight after teaming up with Duncan to win the doubles. In that match Duncan had an impressive win over Ray but couldn't lower Mick's colours. Melanie had probably her best performance of the season at Springfield 'B' with an

impressive win over Paul. At SC&P 'F' Duncan won two and teamed up with Melanie for the doubles, and in the re-arranged match at Milestone 'B' Roy Hull played up from the 'C' team winning two and teaming up with Melanie for the doubles.

Sonning Common & Peppard 'F' had their one success against Birch Copse 'B', Tony House winning all three and Mike Casserley & Dave Aust scoring two apiece. Two wins from Tony & Mike and one from Pete Harman gave them a 5 - 5 draw with OLOP 'H'. However their other two matches were 9 - 1 defeats, Phil Turton beating Paul of Springfield 'B' and Mike beating Ted of Post Office 'B'.

Introduction

Il start by wishing a very merry Christmas to all Reading table tennis players. In eighth place on 34 points are the **Batmen**, for whom Joe Will has performed best. Joe is one of those players stuck in the middle on 52% winning 14 of his 27 sets. Although results haven't been great, match experience will be vital to these young players, and we may see an improvement when the season restarts.


Junior National Championships Success
