The Senior events of the Reading Closed Championships were held over the weekend of the 9/10th February at the Kingfisher Club, Woodley. There was a disappointing entry but those who did play enjoyed a good tournament. Daniel Moses retained his Mens Singles title with an 11-9 11-8 5-11 11-3 victory over lan Cole in the final and he also went on to gain success in both the Mens Doubles and Mixed Doubles.

In the early rounds of the Mens Singles Siad Cole enjoyed an excellent 10-12 11-5 5-11 11-6 11-5 success over Jon Willis and Paul Treadgold battled to an 11-9 fifth game victory against Krys Szczygiel. Gus Thomis overcame Derek Wavell 11-6 11-3 11-5 while Ian Cole held off a

In the Quarter Finals Daniel Moses beat his doubles partner Danny Ricks 11-5 8-11 11-9 11-0, Jeremy Willis edged through by beating Siad Cole 11-4 11-7 8-11 11-9, Mark Banks proved too much for Gus Thomis and Ian through Cole won against Stephen Yon. The semi-finals were very closely fought. Daniel Moses held off division 2 player Jeremy Willis 12-14 11-9 11-4 11-6 while the other semi final was a real thriller with Ian Cole beating Mark Banks 10-12 13-11 4-11 11-9 12-10.



Lisa Williams beat Wendy Porter to lift the Ladies Singles crown, Lisa winning 11-5 11-7 8-11 12-10. In the Veteran Singles Mark Banks defeated Andy Stephens 11-6 9-11 11-5 11-3 to reach the final where he faced Ian Cole, a 11-4 8-11 11-6 11-7 winner against Malcolm Gregory. In the final it was Banks who won another classic match up with Cole 11-6 11-13 10-12 12-10 12-10. The Senior Veterans event was won by Richard Fifield who beat Malcolm Gregory 11-8 11-8 7-11 11-3 in the final, while Colin Dyke triumphed in the over 60's event against Derek Wavell and Mike Dorrington, Derek picked up the runners-up award by beating Mike 11-6 11-6 9-11 11-9.

Daniel Moses and Danny Ricks picked up the Mens Doubles title, beating Mark Banks and Paul Jarvis 9-11 11-5 11-5 11-7 in the final. Moses was also successful in the Mixed Doubles where he teamed up with Wendy Porter to defeat Mark Banks and Lisa Williams 8-11 11-8 11-6 12-10.



The Division 1 Restricted singles was won by Ian Cole after wins over both Lisa Williams and Danny Ricks. Ricks finished runner-up after beating Lisa 11-6 11-9 11-4. The Division 2 event saw Lee Calcutt hold off Sam Ricks 11-8 9-11 11-9 11-9 to reach the final where he faced Jon Willis, 11-9 11-6 11-6 winner against his brother Jeremy. Jon went on to take the title, winning a marathon encounter with Lee 11-7 9-11 12-10 6-11 13-11. Young Sam Liu picked up the Division 3 title, beating Nigel Rowland in the final 11-6 11-1 10-12 11-6. Finally Gus Thomis was the Division 5 winner after he managed a good 11-5 11-8 11-13 11-6 success against Stephen Yon.



Geoff and Richard then teamed up to beat Andrew and Niall 11-5, 9-11, 9-11, 11-6, 7-11 to go 4-3. At this point, the old boys must have thought their first win of the season was a distinct proberpossibility. But as we know, ping pong can be a cruel mistress and the B team came through strongly with Lisa, Niall and Andrew beating Richard Roger and Geoff respectively. In the last game of the evening Andrew defeated Geoff 11-6, 11-6, 9-11, 7-11, 13-11. Could it have been any closer?!!

The only team I haven't mentioned so far is **OLOP 'C'**. So here goes. They lost a very close mid table match against YMCA 6 – 4. They have beaten both Kingfishers 'B' & 'C' by an 8 – 2 margin. They suffered another narrow defeat to Tidmarsh 6 – 4. And yet another 6 - 4 defeat to their B team and a comfortable 7 – 3 victory over Sonning 'A'. 

Tidmarsh 'B' are still in with an outside chance of promotion, but their bid faltered in their last outing as they lost 7 - 3 to rapidly improving OLOP 'D'. Prior to that match they had won against Kingfisher 'F' (8 - 2), Kingfisher 'D' (7 - 3) and Wokingham 'A' (7 - 3). A Dave Wise treble and braces from Mike Aistrop and Chris Webb saw them to an 8 - 2 win over Kingfisher 'F'. They followed that up with a 7 - 3 win over Kingfisher 'D', a result that saw them leapfrog into third. Lee Calcutt and Dave Wise both won all three and François Durand finished with a flourish to record a good victory over Ivor Hardman 11-2, 6-11, 3-11, 11-9, 11-2.

Kingfisher 'D's hopes of promotion have all but ended for another season as they lost to two of their main rivals Tidmarsh 'C' (4 - 6) and Tidmarsh 'B' (3 - 7), they did however defeat struggling Kingfisher 'E' (7 - 3). The trip to Tidmarsh 'B' proved fruitless as they returned home with a 3 - 7 defeat and only wins for Sharon Mitchell and Trevor Organ to show for their efforts, although Trevor & Ivor teamed up to record an impressive 8-11, 13-11, 11-7, 8-11, 12-10 doubles victory over Lee Calcutt and Dave Wise. A 6 - 4 defeat at home to OLOP 'D' followed as Trevor managed a treble with wins over Pu Zhang, Dan West and Chris West. Ivor unfortunately had to concede the last match due to injury. Their only win in 2013 to date came at the expense of Kingfisher 'E' as it was Ivor's turn to record a treble but this time Trevor joined in too to make it a 7 - 3 win. The latest match saw their championship hopes end as Tidmarsh 'C' came to town and went away

with a 6 - 4 win. Ivor started well with a comprehensive win over me and finished it off with a 11-7, 9-11, 11-9, 7-11, 11-6 win over Steve, in the sandwich was a defeat by Andy Stephens.

OLOP 'D' have just got their timing wrong for a promotion push, they are still mathematically in with a chance of both winning the championship and promotion but results now need to go their way. They have had wins over Kingfisher 'D' (6 - 4) and Tidmarsh 'B' (7 - 3) in recent weeks to boost their promotion hopes. Sami Almabrok's last game for OLOP came in the surprise 4 - 6 defeat to Kingfisher 'F' and he signed off with a double which included wins over Michael Houghton and Ashish Bahuguna. Pu Zhang won all three in the narrow win over Kingfisher 'D', Chris West contributed a brace as well. Chris went one better to claim a maximum in the win over Tidmarsh 'B' whilst brother Dan finished with only a win over Terry Hardie.



Post Office 'A' are almost safe for another season despite only winning two of their post-Christmas matches and that was a 6 - 4 victory over Kingfisher 'E' just as the decorations came down where John Simmonds came

through a tight battle with Dave Gostelow 5-11, 14-12, 13-11, 10-12, 11 - 9 and then a comfortable 11-6, 11-4, 11-4 to win the points. Their other win was a 6 - 4 against Sonning C & P 'C' on the 30th January with George White winning two against Jeremy Willis and Matt Stone. The defeats have come against Tidmarsh 'C' (2 - 8), Curzon 'A' (4 - 6) and Wokingham 'A' (1 - 9).

Kingfisher 'F' are struggling for fit players and will need boosting if they are to avoid the drop. It was good to see Mike Dorrington back the other night after missing a few weeks, Steve Woolnough is probably out for the season and Ashish Bahuguna was injured

They will need to pick up points in the forthcoming matches against Post Office 'A' and Wokingham 'A' if they are to stay up. Leo Long has performed really well and in the match against Tidmarsh 'C' he won all three. Michael Houghton continues to improve and he won two in the 6 - 4 win over Kingfisher 'E'.

Wokingham 'A', after several seasons of pushing for promotion, are now suffering from tenth season syndrome and staring the trapdoor of relegation firmly in the face. Isn't it amazing you spend all that money on a new "stand" only to

be relegated the following season.

Brian, Jim and Daryl shouldn't be in this position, they should be safely entrenched in mid-table but for some reason they haven't been able to string wins together this season. Their latest outcome saw them win comprehensively 9 - 1 against Post Office 'A'. Daryl Griffiths and Brian Chinneck both won three, Daryl battled back from 0 - 2 to defeat Simon Hopkins 10-12, 11-13, 11-5, 11-2, 11-8 to give them a 3 - 1 lead. Jim Spencer made it 5 - 1 with a win over John Simmonds and both points were claimed in the doubles as Brian & Daryl were victorious over John & Simon 11-4, 12-10, 11-9.

Kingfisher 'E' need to get Phil Mead playing in all of their remaining matches except their match against Tidmarsh 'C' to boost their chances of survival as he is their number one in the averages with 81%. The four-pointer against Wokingham 'A' will be key to their survival hopes. 2013 started with a 4 - 6 defeat against Post Office 'A', Allan Bruton won two of the four as he beat John Simmonds and George White and it carried on as they then lost 4 - 6 to Kingfisher 'F' as Phil won two and Peter Bennett one.





Hopefully in the end of season bonanza the "love-hate" stats package will be back. In the meantime a final prediction. Curzon Club to be champions with Tidmarsh 'C' to join them in division one and at the bottom it will be Sonning Common & Peppard 'C' to be joined by Kingfisher 'F' in division three. The OLOP youngsters won 7 - 3 to put themselves in with a chance of promotion. Josh Gallen and Sam Liu won all three of their singles contests, with both of them defeating John Tucker and Robin Benwell in the process, as they dropped only three ends between them during the match.

This must have been a shock for **Milestone**, who had won all 13 of their matches up until then with John Tucker and Robin Benwell in sparkling form, but they remain in pole position for pro-


motion with a 3 point lead. However, with matches to come against the teams in 2nd, 4th and 5th (Polish, Tilehurst Meths 'A' & OLOP 'F') they should not take anything for granted.

Meanwhile, Wendy Porter has encouraged and assisted the younger members of her team, Sam, Josh and Siad to this terrific result against Milestone as part of an unbeaten start to the year. This places OLOP 'E' just one point adrift of second placed Polish 'B' with matches to come against 3 of the bottom 4 teams, plus Tilehurst Meths 'A' (who beat them in the first half) and OLOP 'F'. But even if they were to win their remaining five matches, OLOP 'E' would not be guaranteed promotion, for that would need Polish to drop at least one point during the run-in.



So let's look at **Polish 'B'**, who remain in second place after three successive 8 - 2 wins. Previously I said "I couldn't see anyone preventing them from gaining promotion come the end of the season", but I also said "if they can field the two Jaceks for most of their remaining matches, they should end the season in second place". But against Tilehurst Meths 'A' they played with only one Jacek and although Mr. Borysiuk won all three, the other team members could only win one each and they were held to a draw. Their remaining matches include what is now the crunch match of their season - in the penultimate





week they face the return fixture against Milestone, which although it will be at home, could be equally critical for the visitors.

I don't want to say this too loud or rub it in, but it looks as though the relegation places have already been decided. Pangbourne are still struggling to gain a second point while Tilehurst Methodists 'B' are struggling to field a team for their remaining fixtures.

Pangbourne came close to taking a point from their recent match against Springfield when Clive Taylor won two and Pete Welch and Leroy Wilson one each in a 4 - 6 defeat. Pete also lost narrowly to Des Hele 11-9, 10-12, 15-13, 10-12, 8-11. With a couple of postponed matches to rearrange they have more left to play than any other team, but realistically I still don't see them performing a great escape.

Richard Lownsborough is in an impossible position. Due to the other members of his

Tilehurst Methodists 'B' team being incapacitated or otherwise unavailable he is reliant on playing up whoever is available from the other TM teams in Divisions 4 and 6, but having already done this 11 times his options are now becoming limited. However, when the two Tilehurst Methodists teams played each other Catherine Venning put in an excellent performance beating Ian Cockling and Nigel Rowland, then teaming up with Chris Taylor to win the doubles too.

But with his team having suffered 9 defeats on the trot I think Richard has accepted the inevitable and may simply be looking forward to the end of the season and fresh start next September.

Sonning C&P 'D' are the only other team that might be concerned about the threat of relegation, but their recent 8 - 2 win over Tilehurst Meths 'B' will have allayed their fears. In that match Paul Treadgold led the way winning all three for his team, which included two others playing up from Div. 5, Danny Dockree who also won three and Derek Brooke-Wavell who won two.

The remaining four teams have all won a further 4, 5 or 6 points in their matches since the turn of the year, to keep them all mid table.

Tilehurst Meths 'A' had a good draw with promotion chasing Polish 'B' thanks to two wins apiece for Nigel Rowland and Phil Jones. The Tilehurst team came close to taking both points as Nigel Rowland pushed the Polish No. 1, Jacek Borysiuk all the way before losing out 9-11 in the deciding game. Two other wins followed this and with 7 matches left to play they might still seem to have an outside chance of promotion, but this includes fixtures at Milestone and OLOP 'E' so they will probably have to be content with fourth place.

Springfield 'A' have taken 4 points for their last 4 matches (2 points less than they did in the first half), thanks to wins over the bottom two teams. Despite Phil Burke being in the top half dozen or so in the individual averages, they may struggle to pick up many further points this season.

Kingfisher 'G' have taken 4 points from their 5 matches this year, losing to three of the top four teams but beating

Springfield 6 - 4 and Sonning C&P 10 - 0. In their defeat to Tilehurst Meths 'A' Carol Byers was unlucky not to win more than once as having beaten Phil Jones she then had a crackling contest with lan Cockling in which she eventually lost out 16-18 in the fifth game.

They should be aiming to finish the season in the top half of the table, if they can come up with a few more wins.

OLOP 'F' have won 3 of their recent 5 matches, although this was against the bottom three teams, and had defeats to two of the top three. Harry Brough & Pat Daniels remain the backbone of this team, who have 4 scheduled matches and three others still to re-arrange. (Pat-please let me know when you have some

dates for these)

At the bottom it will take a massive change in fortunes for Kingfisher 'I' and Curzon 'C' to survive.

As this is such a short report, due to postponed matches and blank weeks, I would like to make a comment regarding games that are won by an 11-0 margin. I have to ask; is it necessary or sporting that a player should do this to an opponent? Without doubt the form team right now are **Sonning Common & Peppard 'E**'. Two quickfire 10 - 0 wins over strugglers Birch Copse 'B' launched Derek Brooke-Wavell's team back into the promotion picture, while Post Office 'B' (7 - 3), SC&P 'F' (8 - 2) and Milestone 'B' (6 - 4) also found them too hot to handle. Derek, Mike Legg and

Remaining matches: Polish 'C'(a), Springfield 'B'(h), Post Office 'B'(a), SC&P 'F'(h).




Reading Juniors win Carter Cup Regional Zone
